閱讀短文 B

Radiation from x-rays has many beneficial effects. The usefulness of x-rays in medical diagnosis is well known, and when x-rays are used properly, the benefits

almost always outweigh the small radiation hazard. High-energy radiation is used for intentional and selective destruction of tissue such as cancerous tumors. The hazards are considerable, but if a disease would be fatal without treatment, the hazard may be tolerable.

Sources of radiation used for the treatment of cancers and related diseases include artificially produced isotopes. Such artificial sources have several advantages over naturally radioactive sources. The artificial sources have shorter half-lives and are more intense. They do not emit alpha particles, which are not needed, and the electrons emitted are easily stopped by thin metal sheets without appreciably changing the intensity of the desired gamma radiation.
